BRIGADIER GENERAL BRIAN S. LAIDLAW

Brig Gen Brian S. Laidlaw is the Director of Strategy, Plans, Programs, and Requirements, Headquarters Pacific Air Forces, Joint Base Pearl Harbor-Hickam, Hawaii. PACAF's primary mission is to provide ready air and space power to promote United States interests in the Indo-Pacific region during peacetime, through crisis, and in war. He supports the Commander Pacific Air Forces by overseeing a diverse portfolio including strategy, operational plans, international relations, theater security cooperation, and resource programming.

Brig Gen Laidlaw earned his commission from the U.S. Air Force Academy in 1997. Upon completion of Euro-NATO Joint Jet Pilot Training, he served in multiple fighter assignments flying both the F-15 Eagle and the F-22 Raptor. In addition to his flying assignments, Brig Gen Laidlaw was a Legislative Fellow in the U.S. Senate and attended the National War College. Prior to his current position, Brig Gen Laidlaw served as the Chief of Staff at Headquarters United States Air Forces in Europe and Air Forces Africa, Ramstein Air Base, Germany where he developed and implemented policies and programs on behalf of the commander and oversaw the sustainment of forces across two areas of responsibility spanning 104 countries.
