Colonel Melissa J. Milner is the Director of Public Affairs, Headquarters U.S. Pacific Air Forces, Joint Base Pearl Harbor-Hickam, Hawaii. In addition to serving as the communication advisor to the Pacific Air Forces Commander and headquarters staff, she is responsible for communication activities spread over half the globe in support of more than 46,000 Airmen serving principally in Japan, Korea, Hawaii, Alaska and Guam. She provides direct guidance and support to more than 230 Air Force communication professionals and musicians at three Numbered Air Forces and nine Air Force installations across the Indo-Pacific region.



Colonel Milner is a graduate of Louisiana Tech University with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Journalism and was commissioned in 2004 after completing Officer Training School. She has planned and implemented public affairs strategies at the Joint Staff, Combatant Command, Air Staff, air and space operations center, major command, and wing levels. She has deployed to provincial reconstruction teams in Afghanistan and to the Combined Air and Space Operations Center in support of Operations ENDURING FREEDOM and NEW DAWN. Prior to her current assignment, Colonel Milner served as the speechwriter to the Pacific Air Forces Commander.
